## Display a spec whose gutter icon has been deleted

### Some background information

In order to display a specification whose gutter icon has been [deleted](#), it is necessary to navigate to the corresponding "module" in the MangoHome. A module is a folder in MangoHome/store/modules that indicates a method, loop, or case split. As a member of the MangoHome, it also corresponds to a folder in the native file system. Viewed from the package explorer, the encoded file system safe name is exposed. Viewed from the Mango Explorer, the fully qualified name is displayed in "internal form", as specified in section 4.2 of [Java Virtual Machine 2nd edition](#). This represents a compromise between readability and precision. Our interest is in this folder in the Mango Explorer.

### Procedure

1. Locate the module by navigating from the MangoHome folder in the MangoExplorer. The MangoHome will appear whenever the [synchronize](#) button is pressed. Another way to get the MangoHome in the MangoExplorer is to fire the "populate" command. Unfortunately, because of a [bug](#), the drop flag for the folder does not appear until a specification has completed.
1. Double-click on the module folder. The corresponding [translation icon](#) will now appear in the Mango Explorer. You can now double-click or navigate this icon in the usual manner to get specification views.
